Since the day I first proposed creating an original performance to the ODAG ensemble, I have been profoundly changed and honored by the personal revelations shared within this troupe. You see, the process for And Yet We'll Speak includes a twin process that could easily be titled And Yet We'll Listen. This collaboration has repeatedly demonstrated that the courage and audacity both to speak and to listen creates a culture that explodes silence, secrecy and shame. The stories you will witness today come from this ensemble, but they have been rendered through an artistic process in which we changed details and character names. Furthermore, all stories are performed today by actors, rather than the original teller. Distanced from the original teller, and shared today through new specificities of identity and circumstance, we present personal truths carried by a community of artists who travel in and out of each other's worlds along the lines of a story. By venturing into the ephemeral space of make-believe and play, these actors give us encounters to deeper truths about each other and ourselves. In so doing, they offer models for an examination of the beliefs we make and the stories we tell about ourselves and our nation, so that we may return to everyday life with a fuller understanding of our complex world and our own abilities to speak, to listen to act.

Artistic Director's Note

The play that ODAG presents today is the product of a year-long process in which ODAG members have engaged in improvisations, storytelling, interviews, and written compositions – all led by a skilled and talented Oberlin College senior, Lillian White

That process has culminated in *And Yet We'll Speak* – the Honors Project for Lillian's Individual Major in Cultural Performance. Entrusted with the actors' personal stories and reveries, Lillian has devised a beautiful script that enables her and the actors of ODAG to go well beyond those academic goals. The play calls on the men to care for one another's experiences with compassion, and their courageous work calls on us to bear witness to their truths.

Lillian has also demonstrated brilliant leadership over her three years with ODAG – collaborating with me on three other productions; working cooperatively with the staff of the Grafton Reintegration Center; and helping to develop a powerful cadre of Oberlin students who assist in this team process.

As you join this theatrical journey, I hope the players and their play will transport you to their destination – one of new understanding and expanded humanity.
